Have you reviewed your auto or home insurance policies lately?

Just as life changes greatly over the years so will your insurance coverage. You may want to consider taking a few moments to reacquaint yourself with the specifics of your coverage. Be sure to find out what is and what is not covered and determine whether you need additional coverage on top of what your current policy provides. Also, if there are changes to be made or discounts that need to be applied.

Top 10 Auto and Home Insurance Annual Reviews Questions:

1. Does it make sense for you to continue to carry full coverage on your car?
2. Has the value of your home increased significantly over the years?
3. Have you made updates or renovations to your home?
4. Are you now married, divorced, widowed, or had a child?
5. Do you have enough personal property coverage?
6. Have you added an alarm system to your home?
7. Do you need to schedule expensive items on your homeowners policy for expanded coverage? For example, jewelry, electronic and computer equipment, collectibles, tools, etc.
8. Do you need to increase your liability limits on your auto insurance?
9. Should you add towing or rental car coverage to your policy?
10. Do you now need additional coverage in the form of a personal umbrella policy?

How do these changes or situations affect my insurance policy and coverage? Be sure to ask your agent how these changes will affect your insurance policies and coverages.

Interesting Presidential Facts

1. The most common religious affiliation among presidents has been Episcopalian, followed by Presbyterian.
2. The ancestry of all 43 presidents is limited to the following seven heritages, or some combination thereof: Dutch, English, Irish, Scottish, Welsh, Swiss, or German.
3. The oldest president inaugurated was Reagan (age 69); the youngest was Kennedy (age 43). Theodore Roosevelt, however, was the youngest man to become president he was 42 when he succeeded McKinley, who had been assassinated.
4. The tallest president was Lincoln at 6'4"; at 5'4", Madison was the shortest.
5. Fourteen presidents served as vice presidents: J. Adams, Jefferson, Van Buren, Tyler, Fillmore, A. Johnson, Arthur, T. Roosevelt, Coolidge, Truman, Nixon, L. Johnson, Ford, and George Bush.
6. James Buchanan was the only president never to marry. Five presidents remarried after the death of their first wives. Tyler and Wilson remarried while in the White House. Reagan was the only divorced president. Six presidents had no children. Tyler, father of fifteen, had the most.
7. Vice presidents were originally the presidential candidates receiving the second-largest number of electoral votes. The Twelfth Amendment, passed in 1804, changed the system so that the electoral college voted separately for president and vice president. The presidential candidate, however, gradually gained power over the nominating convention to choose his own running mate.
8. The only "two" father and son pairs who both served as President were John Adams and John Quincy Adams and most recently George H. Bush and George W. Bush
9. Woodrow Wilson kept sheep to trim the White House lawn.
10. The teddy bear was named for Theodore Roosevelt because he refused to shoot a bear cub while hunting.
11. Benjamin Harrison was the only grandson of a president to become president
12. William Henry Harrison died one month after delivering the longest inaugural speech at 1 hour 45 minutes.
13. First president to throw out the ball on Major League Baseball's Opening Day: William Howard Taft, on April 14, 1910.
14. Most first pitches thrown by a president: Eight, by Franklin D. Roosevelt
15. Only five presidents have ever worn facial hair when they sought the office. The last was over a century ago, in 1889; Benjamin Harrison.
16. George W. Bush, 43rd president of the United States, and his wife Laura got married just three months after meeting each other.
17. 32nd president of the United States Franklin D. Roosevelt was related, either by blood or by marriage, to 11 former presidents.
18. Often depicted wearing a tall black stovepipe hat, 16th president of the United States Abraham Lincoln carried letters, bills, and notes in his hat.
